Human Papillomavirus (HPV) infects the skin and mucous membranes. It is the most commonly transmitted virus in the world.

You can be infected without showing any signs or symptoms, so you may spread it unknowingly.

4 of 5 adults will be infected in their lifetime

HPV is linked to 33,000 cancer diagnoses in the US each year.

What is the vaccine?

• The human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine is CANCER PREVENTION!

Why do you need the vaccine?

- The HPV vaccine prevents 6 different cancers (mouth/throat, cervix, vulva, vagina, penis, and anus.)
- The HPV vaccine prevents most genital warts
- The HPV vaccine is safe and effective, with no long-term side-effects.

Who should be vaccinated?

All kids (boys and girls) starting at age 9

When should you vaccinate?

Prime time Age 9-12

2 doses

6-12 mo apart

Late

Age 13-14 2 doses

6-12 mo apart

Age 15-26

Critical

3 doses

1st dose, then 2nd dose 1-2 mo later 3rd dose 6 mo after 1st

Benefits of HPV vaccination far outweigh any potential risk of side effects.

Side effects can occur after any vaccine:

- pain, redness, or swelling where the shot was given
- dizziness or fainting
- nausea
- headache
- fatigue
- muscle or joint pain
